Details

- You must be currently enrolled in an AVMA accredited veterinary technology program or a graduate not exceeding 6 months after successful completion of such program.
- You must enroll and attend a summer 2018 World Vets IVM session that has availability. It is nontransferable
 and non-refundable.
- Applications are open to US citizens only.
- Recipient is responsible for making all travel arrangements and is responsible for these expenses along with all other expenses related to the IVM session.
- Recipient is responsible for completing necessary applications/forms provided by World Vets to attend the IVM training (see World Vets website for details)
- If awarded, you will be asked to write and submit a short essay on your IVM experience including how it impacted you educationally and culturally.

To qualify

- 1. Complete scholarship application.
- 2. Provide a 300-400 typed word essay on the following topic:

Explain your interest, understanding and personal plight against pet overpopulation. As a veterinary technician, how will you make an impact against pet overpopulation?

3. Provide proof of enrollment or graduation from a veterinary technology program
